Pupils have made accelerated progress in Foundation Stage. 38% of pupils were at expected level for their age on entry and now 76% of pupils have reached the good level of development. New Ash Green Primary School is performing above the national data for Good Level of Development and in phonics in Year 1 and 2.

Key Stage 2 July Data 2018

Pupils have made very good progress in Key Stage 2. 9% increase in the number of pupils reaching the expected level for writing and a significant increase of 20% in the number of pupils achieving greater depth in writing from 2017.

The pupils achieve above the national data in writing at the expected level and at greater depth.

Significant improvement has been made in Reading as well – an increase off 23% for children reaching the expected level.

All results except SPAG (2%) are above or well above the national data for 2017.

We are very proud of our results and the achievements the pupils have made. These results are the best in recent years and reflect the dedication and professionalism of our staff as well as the hard work and commitment shown by our pupils.
