Readiness to Learn...



In order for children to achieve their potential, they must have a 'readiness to learn'.

<u>School Uniform:</u> We encourage our children to look smart and presentable in school. It is the expectation that children are wearing correct school uniform daily, including appropriate footwear.

<u>Pencil Cases:</u> We will provide all necessary stationary at school. Anything additional that your child would like to bring in should be kept in a named pencil case.

<u>Watch:</u> We encourage children to wear a watch to school to promote good time keeping. No other jewellery should be worn.

<u>PE</u>: Complete P.E. kits should be in school every day. Please ensure that each item of P.E. kit (and school uniform) is clearly named

<u>Water Bottles:</u> We advise that each child has their own non-spill water bottle to keep them hydrated throughout the day – please ensure that water bottles are clearly named.

<u>Snacks</u>: We are a healthy school and it is school policy that morning break time snacks are fruit or vegetables.

SATs in Year 6

In Term 5, children in Year 6 will sit their end of key stage tests, known as SATs. They are an opportunity for your child to 'show-off' all of the things that they have learnt in Years 3-6. They will be assessed in reading, spelling, maths and grammar. There will be a further parents' information session in the autumn to discuss this further, and provide an opportunity for you to ask any questions that you may have.

This year, SATs will take place between Monday 11th May 2020 and Thursday 14th May 2020. Please note that attendance is mandatory and no holiday will be authorised during this time.

Learning at Home

Children in Year 6 will be given homework on a Friday and this needs to be given in on the following Wednesday. Once the children have had a chance to look at their homework over the weekend they might realise that they need help to complete it. If they bring their homework in on Monday, someone will be able to talk them through it. Homework will cover maths and English basic skills.

In addition to weekly homework, the children are required to read for at least 10 minutes every evening and to reflect upon this learning in their contact books. This class teacher checks this daily.

Other areas of learning that can be practised at home are times tables, telling the time and spellings from the statutory list which they will be given at the start of the year.
