The pieces of fruit are put into boxes with an equal number of pears or oranges in each box.

Tiny: There will be 8 pieces of fruit in each box.

Jack: There will be 7 pieces of fruit in each box.

Who is correct, Tiny or Jack? Explain how you know.

Jack is correct because $49 \div 7 = 7$ and $56 \div 7 = 8$ not $49 \div 8 = 6.125$.

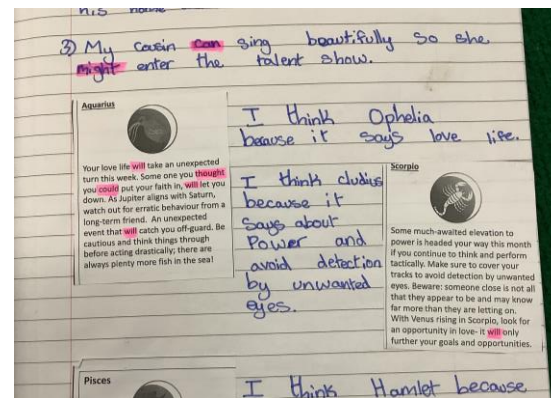
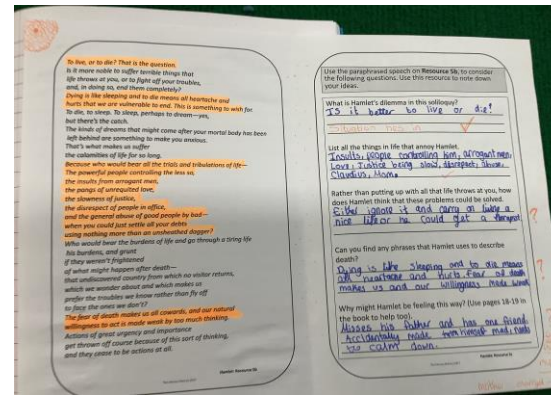
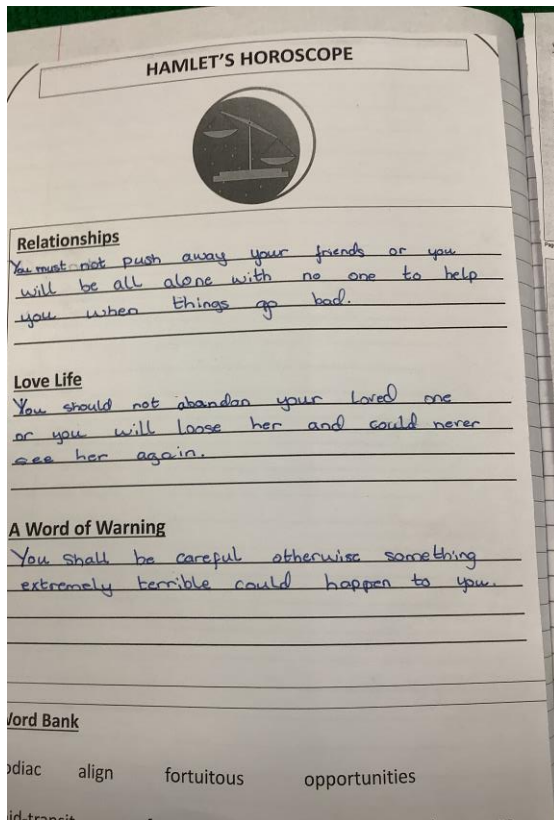
I think this question was a bit challenging but we got to it in the end anyway the answer is true (surprisingly). ✓

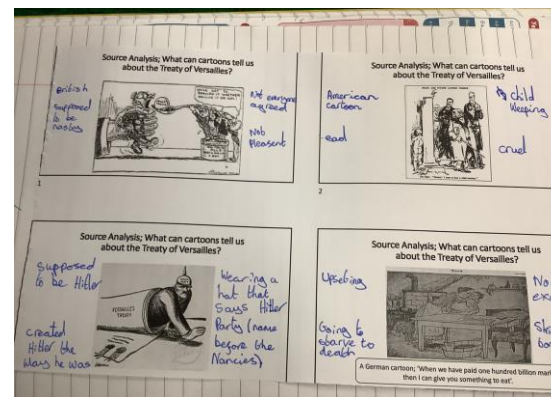
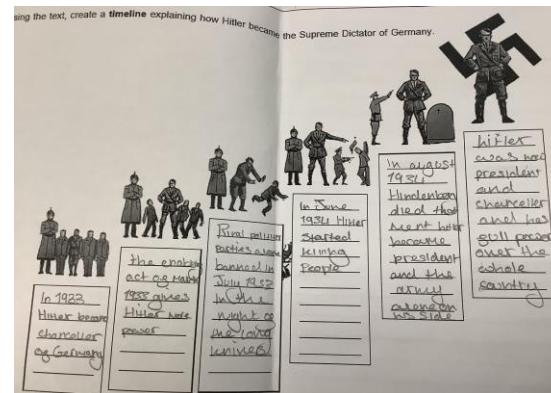
